Why is ADAMHS implementing Recovery Homes?

 ADAMHS Boards are statutorily required to provide recovery housing as part of a continuum of care for substance use disorders by September 2016.

What experience does ADAMHS have with owning and operating residential property?

- ADAMHS has successfully owned and operated property since 1991. Board owned properties house individuals who have been diagnosed with a mental illness and/or substance use disorder, at all levels of severity and need for supervision.
- To determine what type of housing is necessary, ADAMHS identifies needs, seeks out appropriate properties to address those needs, and implements a management program conducive to providing successful housing opportunities for its residents.

Who will live in the recovery home?

- Individuals who live in the Recovery Home will be a Hancock County resident who, through an application and selection process, demonstrate the motivation to:
 - Actively work to live alcohol and drug free lives on a daily basis.
 - Desire a safe and structured living environment with others who share the goal of sobriety.
 - Want to engage in support, services, or treatment opportunities to further their recovery.
 - Pursue employment, increase education, build skills, and actively participate in their community.

How will the recovery home be managed?

- The Recovery Home (house parent) will be governed by a set of house rules which each resident must agree to follow, by signing a Program Agreement, before they are permitted to live in the recovery home.
- The Resident Manager, a peer who has demonstrated longer-term sobriety, will live in the Recovery Home full-time and will oversee the daily operations of the home and ensure that residents are adhering to the house rules.
- The Resident Manager will be under the supervision of the Recovery Support Supervisor and the Executive Director of Focus on Friends, our local Recovery Support Center.
